APWA AZ December Message from the President



The Public Works profession continues to face challenges in recruitment and retention. Sound familiar? We are always hiring in Pima County, and often see firsthand the struggles our colleagues in professional consulting or construction firms have as well. This isn't just a search for engineers – it's at all levels. What is your organization doing to help bridge that gap, and develop new resources for the future of our infrastructure building teams?

Pima County has been working with other local agencies to do outreach via many social media platforms and hold large job fairs targeting both youth and people looking for change. There is a website Arizona at Work – that operates across the state to help link up job seekers, employers, and communities to help train the workforce that local employers need to fill positions. These are targeted by location. Internships are another great route – connecting with local universities early and developing programs that are planned to result in full employment. We have two types of internships here at Pima, including one that is a temporary hire program for under qualified people to train them on the job using external grant funds. This has resulted in a lot of permanent employees with just the right skillset.

Once we have these great workers, how can we continue to provide workforce

development opportunities to grow and keep them with the organization longer? APWA has a lot of opportunities to help with this. You should all know about our awesome Public Works Institute (PWI) run by the chapter. But today I'd like to focus on the APWA Emerging Leaders Academy, or ELA. This is a yearlong national program that provides intensive leadership and management training within the context of public works. The candidates who apply must be working in the field of public works for no more than ten years or have been promoted into their first leadership role in the past three years. Recently, Stefan Whitfield with Maricopa County was accepted into the 2023 – 24 class. Congratulations to both Stefan, and to Maricopa County who will both benefit from participation in the ELA. In my organization, we have had great success with this program, having two graduates within the last five years who have become excellent leaders.

Please consider looking at your organization. Who has recently been given an opportunity to lead, who may benefit from this experience? It's a very competitive program, and the application process will take some effort and planning. The next class is for 2024-25 and applications will be posted in April – but think about how you might incorporate opportunities and training such as PWI or the ELA into your performance planning activities right now. Use extra time during the holidays to reach out to staff and talk about what goals they have for the new year and find ways to leverage APWA development programs to meet those goals. 


